Spring Actions to Help Hedgehogs

Put out water. Food can be put out when hedgehogs are present. Dog, cat or hedgehog food may be used, but lift when not present to discourage rats.

To help increase local populations, **hedgehog holes** in fences are essential for hedgehogs in the spring seeking a mate, water or food. Please consider making these!

If strimming long grass brush through it first to check for hedgehogs and frogs. Slug pellets destroy the hedgehog's food sources, as well as exposing the hedgehogs and wild birds to poisons.

Try to provide **shelter.** Bushes, long grass, log piles or hedgehog houses are examples. Hedgehog houses can be purchased directly from Brampton 2Zero contact as above.

1000 Trees!

1000 trees have now been planted along the Newtown to Irthington footpath with the help of Brampton2Zero volunteers. Trees were provided by the Woodland Trust and were planted with the kind permission of Seat Hill farm.



Exciting NewDevelopments

<u>Hedgerow Planting</u> is an important new development which, as well as carbon capture, provides excellent wildlife habitats and wildlife corridors. Brampton2Zero have been working with farmer Ian Bell at Hallbankgate farm and on Thursday 2nd March worked alongside Fellfoot Forward and locally housed asylum seekers planting 400 metres of hedgerow on the farm.

- 1. Continuing to work on the establishment of a solar co-operative and an Electric Vehicle car share club, alongside starting work on home retrofit surveys.
- 2. Hedgerow planting, further tree planting and tending, and encouraging spaces for wildlife in Brampton.
- 3. Fundraising for a biodiversity officer and a community engagement officer.
- 4. Continuing to develop links with William Howard School, its feeder primary schools and Lancaster University.
- 5. Development of 'Trees for the Future' and 'Commemorative/ Celebratory Trees at Talkin Tarn', and income generation from this.
