

B2Z was awarded £25,000 grant for a feasibility study for a solar co-op and a car scheme. The photo shows the 4700 leaflets about the survey to canvass opinions from the Brampton and the surround community. These leaflets will be distributed to all homes with cost codes CA8 1XX, CA8 2XX and CA8 7XX from 15th August. The results of the survey will be shared in mid September and will influence on whether we set up a solar coop with a car club.
